## Nova Scotia Licensed Accommodations

Licensed accommodation activity includes licensed accommodations purchased by Nova Scotians and non-residents, and people travelling for both tourism and non-tourism reasons. This data does not include any non-licensed accommodations sold through the sharing economy. In August 2019, accommodations operators report that 397,000 licensed room nights were sold, down -3% from 2018. The occupancy rate decreased by 3 percentage points to 73%. The Halifax regions saw increased room nights sold, while the remaining regions declined compared with 2018.

Year-to-date August 2019, licensed room nights sold in Nova Scotia of 1,861,000 were down 2% compared with the same period in 2018. The occupancy rate decreased by 1 percentage point to 53%. Regionally, room nights sold in the Halifax region were unchanged, while the remaining regions declined compared with 2018.
