INTRODUCTION

- Tourism Nova Scotia's 2022/23 Visitor Exit Survey (VES) was administered from April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023.
- This VES report is based on 3,262 questionnaires that were completed by overnight visitors aged 18 years or older who stayed at least one night in Nova Scotia.
- Questionnaires were completed using an online survey. Visitors exiting
 the province through the Halifax Stanfield International Airport, Digby,
 Caribou or Highway 104 (Cobequid Pass) received a VES Response
 Card. The Survey Response Card invited non-resident visitors who
 had spent at least one night in Nova Scotia to complete the VES.
- Data were weighted by month of visit, traveller origin, and mode of travel to reflect the overall non-resident overnight visitor population.
- Comparative data from the 2010, 2015, 2017, and 2019 VES are presented where applicable.

TRIP CHARACTERISTICS






In 2022, nearly half of all visitors report their main reason for visiting Nova Scotia was for pleasure, while nearly four in ten indicate they were visiting friends and family.

The proportion of pleasure visitors continues to grow, with a corresponding decline in the proportion of business visitors. COVID-19 likely had an impact on business travel to Nova Scotia in 2022, with business visitors comprising only 11% of all visitor parties.


Trip Purpose % of Visitor Parties



Overall, there were fewer visitors to Nova Scotia in 2022 compared with 2017 and 2019, and this lower visitation is reflected across the estimates of the number of visitors coming to the province, by purpose of visit.

Factoring in party size, just over one-half of all visitors to Nova Scotia in 2022 travelled to Nova Scotia for pleasure, while one-third were visiting friends and family. One in ten, meanwhile, were travelling for business.






Visitors from Newfoundland & Labrador, Alberta, and Ontario are more likely than other visitors to be coming to Nova Scotia to visit friends and family.

International visitors, as well as visitors from Quebec and British Columbia are more likely than others to be visiting for pleasure.

The incidence of visiting for business is highest among visitors from Atlantic Canada and Quebec.




Trip Purpose % of Visitor Parties by Origin



Visitors arriving in Nova Scotia by road or ferry are more likely than those travelling by air to be visiting Nova Scotia for pleasure.

In 2022, approximately onequarter of visitors to Nova Scotia were visiting the province for the first time.


The incidence of first-time visitors is highest among those visiting for pleasure, and lowest among those visiting friends and family.

Notably, the incidence of first-time visitors is trending upwards among pleasure visitors. Additionally, in 2022 there was an increase in the incidence of first-time visitation among those visiting for business.

% of Visitor Parties by Trip Purpose




Apart from this trip, have you visited Nova Scotia before for at least one overnight (graph illustrates first-time visitors, that is, those who have not visited before)

The highest incidence of first-time visitation to Nova Scotia in 2022 is observed among international visitors, as well as those from British Columbia and Quebec.

Not surprisingly, few visitors from Atlantic Canada report they were visiting Nova Scotia for the first time.

% of Visitor Parties by Origin





Visitors arriving in Nova Scotia by road, who are also most likely to be from Atlantic Canada, are least likely to be first-time visitors to the province.

% of Visitor Parties by Method of Exit




Apart from this trip, have you visited Nova Scotia before for at least one overnight?



With pleasure visitors being more likely to visit Nova Scotia during the May to October period, the incidence of first-time visitors during this period is correspondingly higher than that observed during off-peak months.




VISITOR PARTY SIZE

Party size among visitors to Nova Scotia has been generally consistent over the past several years.

The most common party size is two people, followed by solo travellers.

Party Size % of Visitor Parties




Including yourself, how many people were travelling with you?

Examining party composition by purpose of trip, business visitors are most likely to be travelling alone.


Pleasure visitors are most likely to be travelling as a couple, or as a family.

Those visiting friends and family are equally likely to be travelling alone or as a couple, with one-quarter travelling with family.

Those visiting Nova Scotia for pleasure record the largest average party size.


VISITOR PARTY COMPOSITION




The average length of stay in Nova Scotia increased significantly in 2022, compared with previous years.

This is due to an increase in the percentage of visitors reporting stays of eight or more nights and a decrease in the percentage of those staying for only one or two nights.

Number of Nights Stayed



Travellers from New Brunswick and PEI spend fewer nights in Nova Scotia, compared with visitors from elsewhere.


Average Number of Nights Stayed By Visitor Origin


Average Number of Nights Stayed By Purpose of Trip





Visitors who travel to Nova Scotia by air spend more time in the province, compared with those arriving by road or ferry.


Average Number of Nights Stayed By Method of Exit
